### You prepare Regina for the future

You appreciate and understand the value of the public library as a universal space that welcomes diversity and encourages sharing of knowledge and information. With that in mind, Regina Public Library advanced its goal in 2023 to construct a **new Central Library** designed with more physical and digital spaces to inspire play and imagination, and with ease of access to innovative cultural programming, community services and current technologies. We plan to construct a safe and welcoming building that will benefit Regina and play a significant role in the revitalization of our downtown. Donations committed to our area of highest need will support a new, welcoming Central Library which will strengthen the vitality of Regina, now and for future generations.

### You inspire innovation

Thanks to your support, new and innovative community programming was offered in 2023. **Youth Connect:Indigenous Teachings** provides space for local Knowledge Keepers, Storytellers and Elders to share teachings on Indigenous traditions and culture including origin stories, drumming, and dancing. Focused on reaching urban youth, this weekly program at Cen ral Library consistent-ly attracts newcomer families as well as local teens. The **Acquisition Entrepreneur Accelerator (AEA)** pilot project was offered to individuals ready to invest in Saskatchewan private businesses. It was created through donor funding and RPL's Business and Careers services. Together we equipped 10 aspiring entrepreneurs with skills to successfully acquire and grow an established or franchised Saskatchewan business. **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation** commemorated the ongoing legacy of residential schools. Cadmus Delorme, former Chief of Cowessess First Nation spoke on the generational impact of residential schools, the actions we all can take towards reconciliation and hopefulness for the future. The ceremony included a healing Jingle Dress dance, prayers, and bannock-to-go for over 250 people with another 375 virtual participants.


